
THE YEAR AT A GLANCE...



- Awareness about government initiatives like 'Anaemia Mukt Bharat' and 'Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi' was done through various competitions for Classes VII and VIII.

- A workshop was organised by a panel of doctors from the Public Health Department in collaboration with the Psychology Department of St. Stephen's Hospital on issues like adolescent health, menstrual hygiene and mental and social well-being, among others.
- Students showcased their culinary skills by preparing traditional dishes from the various states of India such as Litti Chokha, Dal Baati Churma, Aloo Posto, Biryani etc.
- A documentary highlighting the importance of water conservation and gender sensitivity, a fun-filled 'matka race', an inter-class quiz competition were some of the other interesting highlights.
- The 'Poshan Maah 2022' concluded with an exhibition of infographic posters, collages and an inter- class competition where nutritionally balanced millet recipes were prepared by the students of Class XI & XII.

THOMASITES FOR EARTH- ECO CLUB ACTIVITIES

- Our school campus has been actively involved in spreading awareness on environmental issues.
- We launched a campaign for 'Phasing out Single-Use Plastic' (SUP) to make our campus single-use plastic free.
- We participated in the Save Soil Movement, a global movement, to address the soil crisis.
- The School partnered with IPCA—Indian Pollution Control Association, for proper disposal of single-use plastic.
- As per the directives of the DOE, we set up a Bartan Bhandar which was used by our Nursery School students to enjoy their mid-day meal in steel 'bartans' (utensils)

- We conducted a workshop with IPCA on Waste Segregation and initiated 'SORT' - Segregation of Organic Waste for Recycling and Treatment to Compost Food Waste.
- Waste Segregation Drive is conducted daily, in which the school's green monitors ensure that each class segregates plastic, paper and food waste.
- We partnered with IPCA to collect the plastic waste and compost the food waste. Paper waste is sent to the paper recycling unit of our school.
- We conducted the Energy Efficiency Program in partnership with EESL, a joint venture of NTPC ltd. and Power Finance Corporation, under the Ministry of Power, to sensitize students to the need for energy efficiency and adopt ways for energy savings and alternative sources of energy.







Environment & Library Integrated Multidisciplinary project




'CLASH OF THE TITANS' AT BISHOP COTTON SCHOOL, SHIMLA


SCHOOL INNOVATION AMBASSADOR PROGRAM
